Blessings for The Doors on Epiphany - January 8, 2012

Mark the inscription **20+C+M+B+12** with chalk above the main door in your home as follows, while proclaiming the corresponding words:

- (inscribe 20) "Two thousand and twelve years ago",
- (inscribe +) "three wisemen",
- (inscribe C) "Casper",
- (inscribe +M) "Melchior",
- (inscribe +B) "and Balthasar, followed the star of God's Son Who became man."
- (inscribe +) "May Christ bless our dwelling",
- (inscribe 11) "and remain with us throughout the new year."



Then say the prayer.

Lord God of heaven and earth, You revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star.

Bless this house and all who enter these doors. Bless those who inhabit this dwelling place. Fill them with the light of Christ, that their concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Lord Jesus Christ, with Mary and Joseph You formed the Holy Family. Remain in our home, that we may know You as our guest and honor You as our Head.

Bless these doors and all who enter this house. May they know the peace and love of God. Grant this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Lord Jesus Christ, through You every dwelling is a temple of holiness. Build those who live in this house into the dwelling place of God in the Holy Spirit.

Bless this door and all who enter through here. May they find peace through Jesus Christ Who is manifested this day. Amen.

Lord Jesus Christ, You became flesh of the Virgin Mary. Grant that Your presence may be known always in this home.

Bless this door, and may all who enter here know the welcome of the Prince of Peace, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Lord Jesus Christ, the three kings presented their gifts to You in praise and adoration. Grant that those living in this house may use their talents and abilities to Your greater honor and glory.

Bless this door and all who enter or dwell in this house. Guide them in ways of peace and love through the Incarnate Word, Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. Amen.
