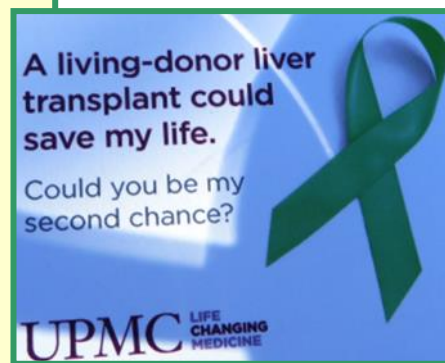

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER ANTHONY.....

BLESSED AND GLORIOUS EASTER!! On this Fourth Sunday of Easter, we acknowledge that Christ is our Good Shepherd and that He desires to lead us to Heaven. Amidst all the noise of the world, we have to listen For the Shepherd's voice. To all that is good, all that is true, all that is beautiful, our Lord will lead us. On "Good Shepherd Sunday," which is also the "World Day of Vocations," Pope Francis offers for our consideration "Saint Joseph: The Dream of Vocation." The Holy Father writes, "Good looks on the heart...., and in Saint Joseph he recognized the heart of a father, able to give and generate life in the midst of daily routines. Vocations have the same goal: to beget and renew lives every day." Please pray every day for vocations to the priesthood and to the religious life.

Today we also celebrate First Holy Communion with seven of our young parishioners – Tanner Ziolk, Garret Saxton, Brynn Haught, Brooke Iwinski, Santiago Rivera Manotas, Mateo Rivera Manotas, and Joshua Izzo will receive the Lord in the Eucharist for the first time at the 11:00AM Mass today. May they always be as close to Jesus in their lives as they are today.

This Saturday, May 1, is the Memorial of St. Joseph the Worker. Praying the Litany of St. Joseph this day, during the "Year of St. Joseph", will aid in obtaining a plenary indulgence. Take time to honor St. Joseph and ask for his intercession!

Just a reminder – we celebrate the Anniversary of the Dedication of the Church on Saturday, May 8. We will have Mass at 10:00AM.

As mentioned last week in the bulletin, Thursday, May 13 is the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. Usually a holy day of obligation, the feast day is not a holy day this year due to the dispensation the Bishops have granted because of the pandemic. Nevertheless, we will celebrate the Ascension of the Lord with two Masses – we will celebrate on Wednesday, May 12, at 7:00PM, and again on Ascension Thursday, May 13, at 8:00AM. I hope that you will be able to assist at Mass at either time. Immediately after the celebration of our Lord's Ascension into Heaven, the Church begins the yearly period of intense prayer for the Descent of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. We will pray the Pentecost Novena after Mass from Friday, May 14, through Saturday, May 22. Because of the Novena, we will have Mass on Saturday mornings May 15 and May 22.

Thanks again to all who have contributed to the success of the 2021 Diocesan Lenten Appeal. Monday, April 19 brought the good news that we have \$80,521 from 157 gifts! Thank you. We are \$31,010 over the diocesan goal. If you have not yet made a gift to the DLA, I encourage you to do so. No gift is insignificant or too small. God bless you.

Thanks to all parishioners who have given of their time after Mass to sanitize the church building and to prepare it for the next use! As you know, we had to guarantee the Diocese that certain protocols would be in place in order to begin the public celebration of Mass again. I appreciate the dedication that has been shown to our parish. The dispensation from Sunday Mass attendance is still in force; however, I encourage one and all to participate at Mass if you are healthy and not at risk. *Please note that the physical distancing requirement is still in place and that we are asked to wear masks in church. We have masks available, if you need one. Thank you. Also, we are now permitted to have 50% occupancy, but we must still be able to maintain the physical distance. I am not sure that we will be able to have 250 persons in church while maintaining the distance, but I hope that this will encourage more parishioners to begin attending Mass again.*


