## **FROM THE DESK OF FATHER ANTHONY.....**

We have come to the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year 2021. We proclaim that we are subjects of the Kingdom of Christ as we celebrate the *Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe*. This liturgical feast is fairly new as compared to other feasts the Church celebrates. Pope Pius XI, when instituting this solemnity in 1925, hoped that a day in honor of Christ the King would usher in “the signal benefits of true liberty, of calm order, of harmony, and of peace.” The Roaring Twenties promised many things that were never delivered. The world was recovering from World War I, and at the same time, in some ways, preparing for World War II already. Fascism, Nazism, and Communism were on the rise, leading to rampant oppression of nations and peoples throughout the world. Pope Pius XI was reminding all the world that true peace will be found only through allegiance to Christ the King. These words that the Pope wrote over 90 years ago are still true today: “The annual celebration of the sacred mysteries is more effective in informing people about the Faith and in bringing to them the joys of the spiritual life than the solemn pronouncements of the teaching Church. Documents are often read only by a few learned men; feasts move and teach all the faithful. The former speak but once; the latter every year and forever. The former bring a saving touch to the intellect; the latter influence not only the mind but the heart and man’s whole nature.” As we listen to the Gospel today at Mass regarding the Last Judgement and the Coming of Jesus Christ in all His glory, we might ask ourselves, “Will we be part of the sheep placed on our Lord’s right, or With the goats on His left?” May our celebration of Christ the King move us to enthrone one Christ as Lord and King of our hearts. ***Come and celebrate Exposition and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament today at 3:00PM, in honor of Christ our King.***



For what will you be giving thanks this Thursday as we celebrate Thanksgiving? I have to admit that this holiday is not one of my favorites, but on the other hand, I have to say it is a necessary holiday. The daily celebration of the Eucharist is an act of thanksgiving, as Eucharist means “thanksgiving.” I try to give thanks to God every day, especially at Mass. Because of the importance of the daily celebration of Mass in my life, the Thanksgiving holiday is not as significant for me as it might be for others. But I do believe that is a necessary celebration because it reminds us that all we have comes from God. God is the origin and source of all good things. I will give thanks to God for His Son, the Church, family, friends, the priesthood, and so many other things. So – for what will you be giving thanks this Thursday as we celebrate Thanksgiving? ***Mass will be celebrated at 8:00AM on Thanksgiving.***

Just a reminder that you may contribute to **Community Service** and/or the **Food Pantry** on any Sunday of the month. However, please be sure that you place your contribution in an envelope clearly marked “Community Service” or “Food Pantry.” This will ensure that your donation goes to where you intend it to go. Thanks for your cooperation.

As you probably know, next Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent – we begin a new liturgical year and reflect seriously on our Lord’s Second Coming at the end of time – He will come in glory, but He will also come with judgement. We also prepare for the celebration of our Lord’s First Coming, when He came among us poor and humble, being born in a manger. Now is the time to accept the poor and humble Christ as Lord and Savior, in order that He will know us when He returns in power and glory. Part of the preparation is a good Confession. I will soon announce opportunities for the celebration of this Sacrament during the Advent Season.

Two holy days of obligation are coming soon! Wednesday, December 8, is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Masses for this great feast will be celebrated Tuesday, December 7, at 5:00PM and again on Wednesday, December 8, at 8:00AM. Our Christmas Mass schedule is as follows: Friday, December 24 – 4:00PM and 10:00PM, and Saturday, December 25 – 8:00AM and 10:00AM. Please remember we will not have the 5:30PM Mass on Saturday, December 25, 2021 and Saturday, January 1, 2022. The usual Sunday Masses at 8:00AM and 11:00AM will be celebrated on Sunday, December 26 and Sunday, January 2.

Our Mass of Remembrance will be celebrated a little late this year. We usually celebrate this Mass during November; however, this year the Mass will be celebrated Sunday, December 5, at 11:00AM. More details to follow.
