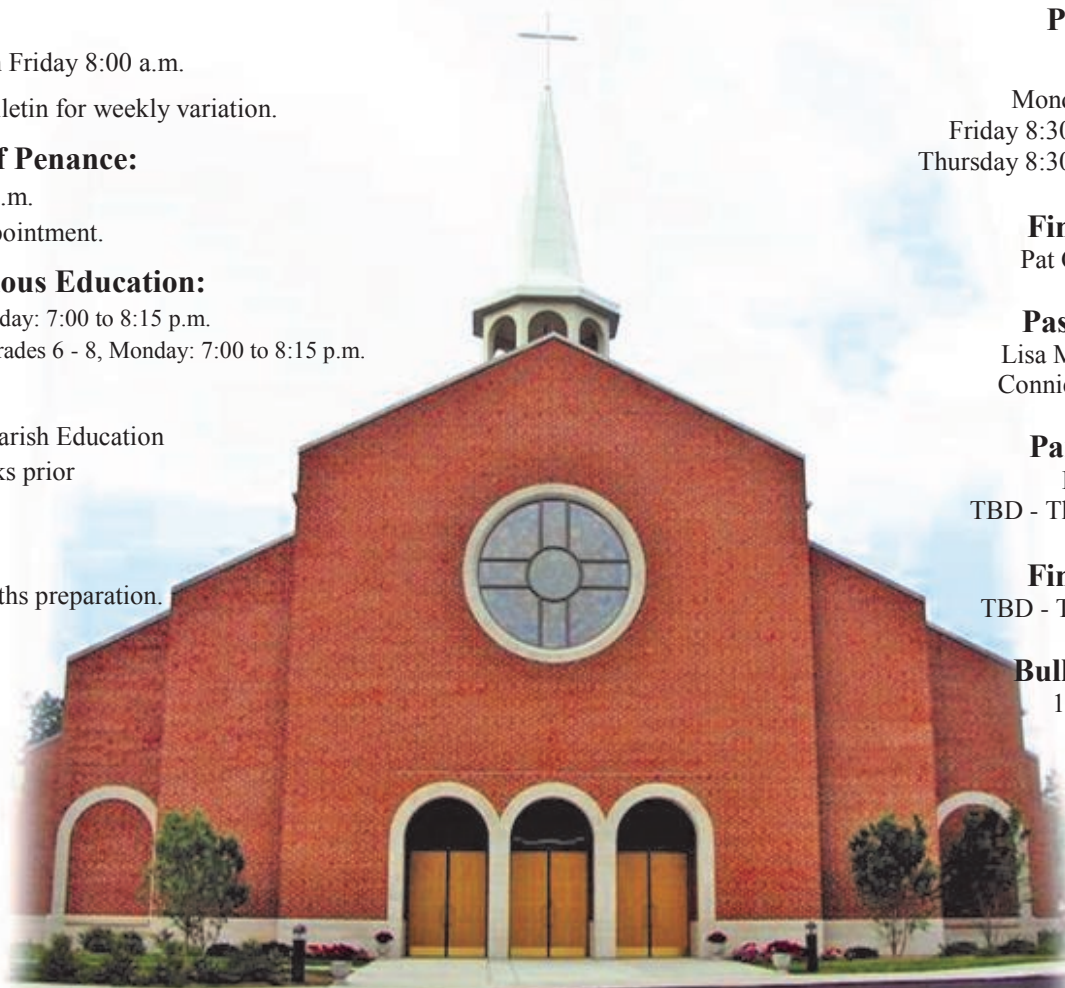

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER ANTHONY.....

We start a new season of faith formation for our children and youth tomorrow. I hope that all children in grades one through eight are registered. We also have a note of gratitude for the RCIA Team: **Daneen Gosser, Richard Gosser, Patty Hall, Tom Becer, and Sue Kenney.** We would not be able to offer faith formation in the same way if we did not have dedicated volunteers and employees.

What's missing? From my understanding and hearing "anecdotal" bits and pieces, we have had varying levels of success in our catechetical efforts for our high school age parishioners. We need to offer something substantial for this age group. We also would like to offer something for young adults; you might recall seeing something in the bulletin a few times regarding this. We hope to establish a steering group soon – if you would like to be part of this group, please let me know.

All parishioners are welcome to participate at Mass tomorrow evening, Monday September 9, at 7:00PM. We will start the new year of Faith Formation with Mass for the children and their parents – but please come and ask God to bestow many blessings on these families and our parish.

Not that I want to rush it, but before you know it, it will be All Saints Day – November 1, a holy day of obligation. All Saints falls on a Friday this year. Our holy day attendance is not great, as you might have noticed. We probably need only 2 Masses for most holy days – excluding Christmas, of course. One of the challenges is that the day before All Saints is Halloween. I wonder how many would come for an anticipated Mass as there are activities like trick-or-treating that evening. I am also wondering how many will attend a 7:00PM Mass on a Friday night, especially if the high school football team is in the playoffs. I am open to suggestions for a Mass schedule for All Saints – but please do me the favor of writing them down. I will not remember your suggestion if you mention it to me before or after Mass.



This Wednesday, September 11, is ***The National Day of Mourning and Remembrance***, also known as "Patriot Day." As you know, we observe the anniversary of the horrific terrorist attack our nation suffered on September 11, 2001, eighteen years ago. We must continue our prayers for peace and justice and for the greater protection of all human life if we hope to have a world and nation of peace and justice. I hope that each of us continues to pray for God's blessing and guidance on "Patriot Day." Pray for all the heroes and patriots of the United States of America – all who heed the call to serve and the men and women who continue to protect us. Pray for those who continue to mourn their losses from 9/11. Pray that they will find comfort in God. ***Pray the Jesus, the Prince of Peace, will reign in your heart and in the hearts of all.***

This Saturday we celebrate the great and glorious Feast of the **Exaltation of the Holy Cross**, which the Church has observed for centuries in acknowledgement of the centrality of the Cross of Jesus Christ. One of my favorite hymns directs us to "*Lift high the Cross, the love of Christ proclaim till all the world adore His Sacred Name.*" This hymn points us to the work of evangelization. Proclaiming the Name of Christ our Lord and Savior is evangelization at its finest. We announce to others that Jesus Christ, the Son of God, True God and True Man, has saved us from our sins and opened the gates of Heaven through His Cross and Resurrection. So, lifting high the Cross, waving the Cross, making the Sign of the Cross prayerfully, and honoring the Cross in our homes are great ways to share our faith in Jesus Christ. The Church glorifies the Cross because it is through the Cross that we receive redemption. Christ's great sacrifice has set us free. The Cross is the sign of triumph over hell, sin, and death; even more gloriously, it is the royal banner and tree of light and life, as it is raised against the darkness of the shorter days we now experience. I hope that each of us has a place of honor in our home for the Crucifix – where the Cross is raised, the devil and the power of sin flee! The Cross here proclaims Jesus to be **Lux – Light, Dux – Lord, Pax – Peace, and Rex – King.** *We adore You, O Christ, and we praise Thee, because by Thy holy Cross Thou hast redeemed the world!*

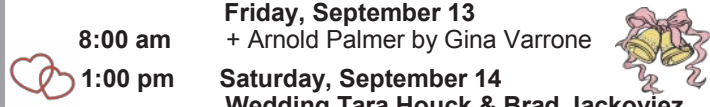
